FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Time has a way of catching up on you. It seems only a short time since I was last asked to contribute to an edition of the Parish Pump but on reflection a lot has happened since then. In this edition there is some news of past and future events and also some attempts at humour. At least, the authors hope that you will find them humourous.

There are likely to be bye-elections in the near future though, we understand, that the impending General Election is likely to push these back to the end of May. This is just as well, for Parish politics have little to do with the national scene and should not be confused. This does not mean that they are unimportant, the opposite is true, for they have a big effect on the life of our village. We understand that, even in Parishes which have a party political make-up, this really does not show in making local decisions.

We are currently three members short. The sad illness and death of Madryn Waldron has been especially hard to bear as she was so dedicated to the village which she had adopted as her own. She had a keen Cornish sense of humour and was always ready to be called upon.

Norma Stubbington, who was a very good Chairman of our Planning and Development Committee moved, on her husband's early retirement, to Leominster and we miss her in our meetings.

Cyril Eustice, who was always ready with sound financial advice and took

over from Norma, has been forced to resign due to pressure in his working environment. He will be another hard act to follow.

Nevertheless, the remaining thirteen continue to work hard on your behalf. Our presence at the Environment Day at Watersmeet is a good example of the pleasant tasks that we undertake and brought a lot of interest. But, we can be serious too. None more so than when we are dealing with the Parish Precept.

Our financial deliberations, at the turn of the year, resulted in our setting an identical precept as last year. Any variation in your Council Tax comes from other sources than us. Yet, we have an ambitious programme for the coming year all designed to improve the local and to foster environment community spirit. This is not a party political message but comes from all of us who care about Croxley Green and its people.

Our Rangers work tirelessly to keep our village tidy and a pleasant place to live. Footpaths are worked upon by them and, because of that the Countryside Management Service have also contributed materials and labour to make them safer. In this respect we shall be erecting footpath signs to demarcate all our footpaths in the coming months. We can't let Sarratt do it all.

It can be fun working on the Parish Council but it can also be frustrating. Official wheels tend to roll slowly and impatience is the biggest problem that is raised at our regular meetings. All our meetings are open and we will welcome you to come and listen. There is always a space for you to air your views. We do have some regular visitors and we have become firm friends.

As we near the end of the Council year, I should like to say a big thankyou to all our councillors for the work that they put in. It is all voluntary, unpaid, and can take up a considerable chunk of leisure time and, yet, there are numerous examples of unstinting effort which is given for the good of our community. Thank you to the three who are no longer with us and also to those who soldier on and make my life easy.

MADRYN WALDRON PARISH COUNCILLOR

For sometime the Environment Committee has been missing one of its members. Madryn, from the time when she joined in August 1993 was enthusiastic to offer her assistance in the Committee's activities.

Her contributions to our meetings would bring a touch of humour to our discussions on several agenda items each month.

One of the earliest memories of Madryn was an occasion in Stones Orchard when we were "Ragwort Pulling" This plant was very invasive and taking over several areas of the grassland. We pulled up over 1,000 plants in a few hours during one hot Sunday, with volunteers. Armfuls of Ragwort were pulled up by Madryn and she was quite proud that she found the tallest plant!

The Committee has become involved in many, many projects and activities in the past few years including Clean-Up days, tree planting and the Garden Competition to name but a few.

Whatever the activity Madryn never failed to be "on hand" to "lend a hand".

There are three separate loops for this walk or they can be walked as one.

This included a walk around one of the "loops" with a "Treasure Trail" of clues to guess environmental features seen on the route. In addition Easter Eggs were given to those who completed the forms with correct answers to the quiz.

PARISH PATHS PARTNERSHIP

The Environment Committee has now completed its survey of the 18 Parish urban/rural footpaths with a detailed plan of each footpath sign showing the related designation and footpath number.

The Council has agreed these signs should be ordered. They will gradually be put into their positions by the Parish Rangers as their work load allows.

In some instances the poles/water/cement etc will physically have to be walked great distances to install the signs.

In total some 41 poles and 52 signs are required to bring the Parish in line with the footpath numbers that have been renumbered in conjunction with requirements recommended by the Countryside Commission/Parish Paths Partnership, Hertfordshire County Council and Parishes.

We are fortunate that our grant from the Partnership will offset some of the expenditure for this countryside furniture.

During February the Countryside Management Services have improved a precarious slope on footpath No 7 (leading from the Revels site, The Green) by creating steps to assist with ascending/descending a slippery area in wet conditions.

DOG HYGIENE

To assist with this problem the Environment Committee has increased the number of bins for disposing of the faeces whilst the owners are exercising their pets.

Special bags for collecting and removing faeces from the pathways are available FREE OF CHARGE from the Parish Office and these may be disposed of in the bins.

BUS SHELTERS

Observant passers-by and regular bus travellers will have noticed that several new bus shelters have appeared around the village. These, whilst uncompromisingly modern, are tastefully coloured green and have some form of seating for waiting pasengers. They are erected by courtesy of Hertfordshire County Council and provided by Three Rivers District Council and the Parish Council.

We have been anxious to carry out this exercise for the last year. We had planned to provide one replacement and one new shelter outside the Red House and at the bottom of Watford Road before the winter set in.

We then discovered that Three Rivers District Council also planned to replace the shelter in Repton Way and provide another at the bottom of Baldwins Lane, so it was sensible to co-ordinate our efforts. This exercise showed that we had to obtain approval from Hertfordshire County Council, not to mention a proportion of their cost.

Then came the hitch - the specifications were changed - to allow the shelters, at some future time, to take indicators which would give information of the expected time of arrival of the bus.


This caused some delay and so the shelters were not finally erected until February but they are there now and TRDC are awaiting another before long.
