WE HEAR . . .

THE STORY OF THE WELCOME CLUB APPEAL

It is now three months since the Appeal was launched to raise £3,000 for this project and it is a long time since a local matter aroused so much interest. Unfortunately there are a lot of 'stories' circulating which are little better than fancy. As far as we are aware Croxley Green is leading the way for the whole country as this is the first time three bodies have combined to sponsor an Old People's Club. Outright grants have been made by the Herts County Council, Rickmansworth Urban District Council, and the British Red Cross Society; the latter participation being necessary before the other two could legally contribute. In addition to these grants the Rickmansworth Urban District Council agreed to make a loan of just under £3,000 otherwise the Club building would not have started. Naturally the Club wishes this loan to be fully repaid before the opening in just under a year's time. We should like to stress that *all* contributions to the Appeal will be used in Croxley Green and nowhere else. The plans include a hall which will be used in the day-time by the old folks and available for letting in the evenings at rents which will provide funds for running the Welcome Club.

The first brick was laid on July 17th by Mr. Wilcox who has done so much for the Club and who was for many years a member of the Committee of the C.G.R. & R.A. Another way of contributing is to buy a brick at 2s. 6d. each which are being sold on the site on Saturdays. The names of all who contribute in this way will be recorded in a book to be kept in the Club.

HOW THE APPEAL GOES

At the time of going to press the amount actually received by the Welcome Club Appeal has reached £1,000, which is over one-third of the way to the target of £3,000. If you were away when the envelopes were collected you may like to send your donations to the Appeal Treasurer, Mr. A. E. Jeffery, at 7, Old Barn Lane.

CROXLEY GREEN WELCOME CLUB APPEAL

An extract from a letter from the Appeals Committee Secretary reads: "Dear Mr. Broome, The Welcome Club Appeal Committee would like you to know how very grateful we are to you and your willing helpers in delivering our appeal letter to every house in Croxley Green. You tackled a mammoth task and succeeded splendidly, everything went very smoothly and the collection was made very simple by your marvellous organisation".

PIGEONS

The vexed question of pigeons roosting under the railway bridge in Baldwins Lane and their droppings on the footpaths below has now caught the attention of the "Watford Observer" and perhaps the spotlight of publicity will goad the Council to take action once and for all. We are pleased to record that Councillor Crawley is particularly interested at the present time and knows of the partial success achieved by the use of narcotics which (the Public Health Inspector admits) has not been successful. The thing to do is to stop the birds roosting under the bridge. They come and go with the seasons and when some are killed they are later replaced by others. This is a problem which has been from "pigeon-hole" to "pigeon-hole" for too many years. It is high time this nauseating business got into the tray marked 'immediate effective action'. The Association's Committee and the public are tired of reading Council Minutes (which once proposed the installation of a baffle; now changed to the use of narcotics which being a poison of degree can have repercussions). **This Association now calls on the Local Authority for rapid and effective action.**

AND OBSERVE

CROXLEY GREEN BRANCH POST OFFICE

The future of the Branch Post Office in Watford Road was in jeopardy about a year ago because of alleged insufficiency of business. Now it is noted that the Council has granted formal permission for the continuing existence of this temporary building until 1968. Isn't it about time that Croxley Green was granted a Post Office in a permanent building? We think so, and will use our best endeavours to achieve this object.

YOUR POST OFFICE

The Croxley Green Branch Post Office will now close at 5.30 p.m. on Saturdays, and proposals have been made by the Head Postmaster for the weekday opening hours to be reduced to 9 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. Rickmansworth Council has deprecated this move and will seek talks with the Head Postmaster. It is always difficult to administer the public service to the satisfaction of staff and customers, but we do hope for the benefit of many residents that it would be best to have the latest possible closing time, not earlier than 6 o'clock, because it's a national failing that we have to "rush to catch the post".

(The new hours will operate from October 4th. Ed.)

MORE NEWS OF THE NORTH ORBITAL ROAD

BANKING FACILITIES IN CROXLEY GREEN

Some three years ago the Association asked the "Big Five" and other banks to provide a local branch, and although replies were negative at the time it now looks as if a branch of Barclays Bank will soon appear at 2, Barton Place, New Road (opposite the Guildhouse). Twenty-six years ago we had two sub-branch banks in Croxley Green.

THE CHURCHILL TREE

Sunday, 28th November, at 3 p.m. will be the time for the planting of the Association's tree in commemoration of the late Sir Winston Churchill. The site is at the top part of The Green about 50 yards in front of Dugdales and towards Croxley House.

STREET NAME-PLATES

Following pressure by the Association we are glad to see that several road intersections have been given name-plates. In one instance this has taken over a year to achieve!

NEW FOOTPATH NEAR CROXLEY MET. STATION

The Association has for a long time pressed for the provision of a footpath from Croxley Met. Station along Watford Road to the entrance to the goods yards. It looked as though this would happen this year until the County declined a grant. The difficulty has now been overcome by the Rickmansworth Urban District Council paying £50 so that the total cost falls that much below £3,000 thereby becoming a "minor" improvement instead of a "major" one. Really! isn't it time these two local authorities eliminated red-tape and got the work done in the interests of the people who foot the bill and who would like to foot the path as well in the interests of Road Safety.

LAND AT CASSIO BRIDGE

Messrs. Arthur Pitkin Ltd., whose store is on this 3½ acres of land, of which part will be needed for the Cassio Bridge development, have offered the remainder of the land to the Council with vacant possession. Negotiations will proceed. Readers may like to be reminded that several years ago "*The Croxley Green Resident*" published a coloured sketch showing how a block of shops would look on this site partly fronting Watford Road and shaped on the curve into Baldwins Lane. Alas this project never materialised, but now that the Council are contemplating spending our money on acquiring this land they might like to have a firm suggestion as to something really useful that they could organise on this corner. Incidentally, this area is a very poor entrance to Croxley Green at the present time as also is the Council owned land adjoining Croxley Green L.M.R. Station on the opposite side of the main road.

(The offer has now been withdrawn - Ed.)

INTERFERENCE WITH FOOTPATHS

In recent years there have been two cases in Croxley Green where a building contractor has so interfered with the footpath as to make its use dangerous for pedestrians. The Association took the matter up and it is now recorded that a resolution urging legislation has been approved by the London Accident Prevention Council.

HOUSE PURCHASE ADVANCES

During a recent meeting of the Rickmansworth Urban District Council Finance Committee it is recorded in one place that the Council will make application to borrow £100,000 for advances for house purchase, but earlier in that meeting it was resolved that no further house purchase advances be made for the time being excepting applications in hand.

GRANTS TO AGED PERSONS ORGANISATIONS

For its annual grant the Council has earmarked £150 in 1956/66 for the Croxley Green Welcome Club, with grants of £250 to the Darby and Joan Club, and £100 to Croxley House.

OPERATION "NEPTUNE"

The Council has made a contribution of £25 to the preservation of Britain's *coastline* as part of an appeal by the National Trust reported to the Urban District Council's Association recent Conference at Torquay.

SPREAD THE RATE LOAD

While Mr. Crossman thinks in terms of lightening the rate burden by putting more on to the Exchequer, the Association of Municipal Corporations suggest this be done by spreading the rate-net far wider. They propose that de-rated farms and nationalised concerns should pay their full whack, and the outcry might easily, if adopted, send basic prices soaring. Nevertheless, there is an obvious case for casting the net wider, especially to levy rates on empty office blocks, shops, as well as houses. This whole problem is manifest in its implications but it is, especially from the ratepayers point of view, highly desirable that every property bears its full responsibility whether it is occupied or not.

HEAVY VEHICULAR TRAFFIC

Undoubtedly the incidence of heavy—and often long-distance—traffic is a major problem in many parts of the country as well as Croxley Green. The hazards of heavy vehicles are manifest when the vehicle fails to behave in a road-worthy manner either because it is improperly maintained or it is carrying a load larger or heavier than the vehicle is capable of transporting without danger to other road users including pedestrians. The Ministry of Transport is developing its scheme for the roadside testing of commercial vehicles and so far this year it is stated officially that 56 per cent. of vehicles tested have not been satisfactory.

As the Minister of Transport has said that he will set up further testing points the Association has suggested that one of these should be on Scots Hill so that M.O.T. Inspectors could be on the spot when a vehicle breaks down on the hill. After having submitted this suggestion to the Minister of Transport the Association sought the support of the Local Authority who, in their wisdom, deviated from the problems of Scots Hill by saying that a testing-point might be sited on the Denham Way. Fortunately your Member of Parliament, Mr. Longden, thought our suggestion a good one. A reply from the Ministry of Transport tends to reject the suggestion saying that the important factor in choosing a site for a testing station will be the availability of a high number of vehicles to attend for testing at a pre-arranged time. They believe a booking system for testing will be essential, as it is intended to use production line testing techniques thus achieving a high throughput of vehicles.

ANCIENT BUILDINGS

For a pleasant Sunday afternoon stroll you might like to see the Tithe Barn in the grounds of Croxley Hall Farm. The Council has taken responsibility for its future and it could cost £6,000 for repairs on the site. Another idea, at a possible cost of £40,000 would be to dismantle and place it on another site—one suggestion is an open site at the south-western end of The Green.

Also on The Green, inside Croxley House, there is an 18th Century wooden well-head which is now scheduled as an ancient monument, and Croxley House itself has been added to the supplementary list of official ancient monuments.

WATFORD RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Some parts of Croxley Green fall within the area of Watford Rural District Council and residents concerned might like to know that their local Councillors are Cllr. W. G. L. NONPLUSSED

To the Editor. Sir, May I, through your magazine, say how puzzled I am that our eight Croxley Ward Councillors do not appear to stand up for Croxley Green. I am a resident who believes that it would be beneficial to have "Croxley Green" signs appearing at suitable places on the main road (A.412) because I know how it is for the motorist not to know where he is. At the present time there is not even an indication that the traveller is in Rickmansworth Urban District area let alone in Croxley Green. Yet he has either just come from or is going to Watford where he will find "West Watford", "Garston", "Oxhey", "North Watford". How is it that two neighbouring authorities contrast in their actions? I note from the last Council Minutes that the Rickmansworth Urban District Council has again turned down your recommendation to have "Croxley Green" signs, and I know also that the Engineer was instructed (nearly two years ago) to put up boundary signs on the A.412 and A.404 main roads, yet this has not yet been done. In conclusion, I know that 40 per cent. or thereabouts of the resident and electoral population of our Urban District live in Croxley Green, and I say all power to our Residents Association in pressing the Council to do things such as this which are so obviously (to me) desirable for our locality.

COOKING RECIPE

The Never Fail Sponge: 2 ozs. corn oil, 2 eggs, ^{Table} 1 tea-spoon milk and water, 4 ozs. castor sugar, 3½ ozs. s.r. flour, ½ oz. cornflour. Beat eggs and milk well together, add sugar, beat hard for several minutes, fold in the flour and baking powder with pinch of salt, lastly stir in the oil. Divide batter between two well buttered 8 in. sandwich tins. Bake in moderate oven gas no. 5 or 375 degrees F. for 12/15 minutes, then leave in the tins for 10 minutes before turning out. Spread filling and complete as sandwich by sprinkling castor sugar on top
